Aggravated Robbery

On Friday, June 24th, 2016 at 3:36 a.m., the Woodstock Police Department responded to the Shell Gas Station, located at 315 N. Madison St. Woodstock, in reference to a report of an armed robbery.

Information was developed by the Woodstock Police Department's Criminal Investigations Division which led to the identification of three male juvenile suspects; ages 14, 15 and 17. With this information, Detectives obtained a search warrant for an apartment building located in the 700 block of Prairie View Ln. Woodstock, which was the residence of the 15 year old suspect.

Members of the Woodstock Police Department executed the search warrant with the assistance of the McHenry County Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT team; SWAT became involved due to the purported use of a firearm by the offenders in the Armed Robbery. The three juvenile suspects were located inside of the apartment and taken into custody without incident.

Information was later developed as to the whereabouts of the firearm used during the Armed Robbery. It was later located near the Shell Gas Station on a rooftop of a local business and deemed to be a toy BB gun.

After conferring with the McHenry County State's Attorney's Office, the three juveniles were charged with one count each of Aggravated Robbery, a Class 1 Felony. The three juveniles were subsequently transported to the Kane County Juvenile Justice Center in St. Charles, IL, where they remain in custody, pending a Detention Hearing in the near future.
